RECYCLING OF FIRE DEBRIS NOW RESTRICTED TO ESCONDIDO RESIDENTS

Effectively immediately, the City of Escondido's Public Works Yard will no longer accept fire demolition debris from non-residents. Previously the City of Escondido allowed residents from Bonsall, Fallbrook, Valley Center, Mountain View, Mary Lane, Highland Valley, Poway, Rancho Bernardo, Via Loma Vista, and Del Dios, and other unincorporated areas to bring construction-related asphalt and concrete to the Public Works Yard for recycling. Unfortunately the Yard is nearing capacity due to the number of homes already demolished and now must restrict this service only to Escondido residents whose homes are still being demolished by Clauss Construction, a demolition company under contract with the City.

Twenty-one homeowners agreed to have their properties cleared by Clauss Construction. Already fifteen of the properties have been cleared. Demolition on the remaining six properties, all located on the west side of Interstate 15, will begin on January 9. Completion is anticipated by the first week of February.
