Hi

I am currently working on an expedited application for a Conditional Use Permit for the old Palomar Pomerado Health building at 1817 Avenida del Diablo. The site is being

leased to Southwest Key Programs which is a government contractor under the US Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Refugee and Resettlement. The program will consist of housing 96 unaccompanied minors between the ages of 6-17 while they try to reunite them with their relatives in the US or in their country of origin. Many services are provided on-site while the minors are living there, such as case management, recreation, education. No changes are proposed inside the building or on the site, with the exception of fencing to secure the site. We are still working with them on an appropriate siting for fencing, but their desire is to keep the individuals on-site and not wandering off. I am hoping that this can be accomplished with fenced in patio areas and maybe door alarms rather than fencing in the entire site as they are proposing. They indicate that residents are not considered detainees and the staff have parental authority over them, supervising them constantly.

I do not have a good floor plan of the facility yet, but hope to soon and can deliver it to you. My question to you is do you have any concerns with this facility or want to add any conditions to the CUP? I will be happy to send you anything I have or direct you to their website. I also plan to speak with someone at the City of Yougtown, AZ this week about any issues at their existing facility. Thanks
