ELECTRONIC MEDIA:

SUBJECT: Certification of November 2020 General Municipal Election and Special Election

Results

DEPARTMENT: City Clerk's Office

RECOMMENDATION:

It is requested that the City Council adopt Resolution No. 2020-153 certifying the November 3, 2020, City of Escondido General Municipal and Special Election and declaring the results.

FISCAL ANALYSIS:

Funds for election expenses in the amount of \$385,000 were approved in the Fiscal Year 2020-21 General Fund budget. Final costs should be available from the Registrar of Voters within the next 60-90 days.

PREVIOUS ACTION:

On June 24, 2020, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2020-67 calling for a General Municipal Election to be held on November 3, 2020, to elect one (1) City Council Member – District Two, with a two-year term; one (1) City Council Member – District Three, with a four-year term; and one (1) City Council Member – District Four, with a four-year term. The City Council also adopted Resolution No. 2020-68 requesting the San Diego County Board of Supervisors/Registrar of Voters to consolidate Escondido's Municipal Election with the Statewide General Election.

CONCLUSION:

In accordance with the California Elections Code, certification of the canvass of the returns from the General Municipal Election held on November 3, 2020, is to be presented to the City Council for action. The official certification from the Registrar of Voters is attached to Resolution No. 2020-153 as Exhibit "A."

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-153

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ESCONDIDO, CALIFORNIA, RECITING THE FACT OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION AND THE SPECIAL ELECTION HELD ON NOVEMBER 3, 2020, DECLARING THE RESULTS AND SUCH OTHER MATTERS AS REQUIRED BY LAW

WHEREAS, a General Municipal and Special Election was held and conducted in the City of Escondido, on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, as required by law; and

WHEREAS, a notice of the election was given in time, form and manner as provided by law; that voting precincts were properly established; that candidates were nominated to fill the vacancies as provided by law; that election officers were appointed and that in all respects the election was held and conducted and the votes were cast, received and canvassed and the returns made and declared in time, form and manner as required by the provisions of the Elections Code of the State of California for the holding of elections in general law cities; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 2020-67 was adopted June 24, 2020, calling for and giving notice of a General Municipal Election and Special Election to be held on Tuesday, November 3, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 2020-68 was adopted June 24, 2020, requesting the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego and the Registrar of Voters to consolidate a General Municipal Election to be held on November 3, 2020, with the Statewide General Election to be held on the same date; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with California Elections Code Section 15400, the Official Canvass of the Returns from the General Election held on November 3, 2020, is

prepared by the San Diego County Registrar of Voters and the results are declared by the City Council as to who was elected. The official certification from the San Diego County Registrar of Voters is attached as Exhibit "A" and is incorporated by this reference.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Escondido, California, as follows:

SECTION 1. A General Municipal and Special Election was held and conducted in the City of Escondido, on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, as required by law. The whole number of ballots cast in said City for District Two Council Member – Short Term was 17,546; that the whole number of ballots cast in District Three for Council Member was 12,779; that the whole number of ballots cast in District Four for Council Member was 15,910.

SECTION 2. That the names of persons voted for at the election by voters in the City of Escondido for District Two – Short Term - for Member of the City Council to represent District Two are as follows:

That the names of persons voted for at the election by voters in District Three for Member of the City Council to represent District Three are as follows:

SECTION 3. That the number of votes given at each precinct and the number of votes given in the City to each of the persons above named for the respective offices for which the persons were candidates and for and against the measures were as listed in Exhibit "A" attached.

SECTION 4. The City Council does declare and determine that Tina Inscoe was elected by voters in District Two as Member of the City Council – District Two for the short term of two years; Joe Garcia was elected by voters in District Three as Member of the City Council – District Three for the full term of four years; and Michael Morasco was re-elected by voters in District Four as Member of the City Council – District Four for the full term of four years.

SECTION 5. That the City Clerk shall enter on the records of the City Council of the City of Escondido a statement of the results of said election, showing:

- a. The whole number of votes cast in the City;
- b. The names of the persons voted for;
- c. For what office each person was voted for;
- d. The number of votes given at each precinct to each person; and
- e. The total number of votes given to each person.

SECTION 6. That the City Clerk shall immediately make and deliver to each of such persons so elected a Certificate of Election signed by the City Clerk and duly authenticated; and that the City Clerk shall cause to be administered to each person elected, the Oath of Office prescribed in the State Constitution of the State of California, and shall have them subscribe to it and file the same in the office of the City Clerk. Each and all of the persons so elected shall then be inducted into the respective office to which they have been elected.

SECTION 7. That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of the resolution; shall enter the same in the book of original resolutions of said City.

SUBJECT: Appointment of Deputy Mayor

<u>DEPARTMENT</u>: City Clerk's Office

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: It is requested that the City Council appoint Councilmember Michael Morasco to serve as Deputy Mayor in accordance with Ordinance No. 2020-28.

<u>BACKGROUND</u>: On November 18, 2020, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 2020-28, which amended Chapter 2, Article 2, Section 2-24 of the Escondido Municipal Code as follows:

Sec. 2-24. Deputy Mayor Selection.

- (a) The city council shall meet on the first Wednesday following certification of the results of the general municipal election and select a deputy mayor by appointment from among the councilmembers. If the deputy mayor leaves elected office, the city council shall appoint a new deputy mayor at the next regular city council meeting.
- (b) The deputy mayor shall serve a one-year term.
- (c) The deputy mayor position shall rotate among councilmembers representing the four council districts.
 - (1) The city council shall appoint the deputy mayor based on seniority in current office. Each councilmember shall be appointed deputy mayor at least once during their four-year term in office.
 - (2) If multiple councilmembers have the same seniority at the time of appointment, the city council shall appoint the deputy mayor based on the highest votes received in the general election.
 - (3) If a councilmember fails or refuses to serve as deputy mayor, the councilmember shall not serve as deputy mayor until the other three councilmembers have another opportunity for appointment.
- (d) No city councilmember should be appointed deputy mayor during their first year in office.
- (e) The city council retains the right to appoint the deputy mayor by majority vote, notwithstanding subsection (b), whenever it deems necessary.

Therefore, since Councilmember Morasco is the most senior member of the City Council, he is next in line to serve as Deputy Mayor.

ORDINANCE NO. 2020-28

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ESCONDIDO, CALIFORNIA, TO REPEAL AND REPLACE ESCONDIDO MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 2 ADMINISTRATION, ARTICLE 2, CITY COUNCIL, SECTION 2-24, SELECTION OF DEPUTY MAYOR

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 36801 authorizes a City Council to appoint a mayor pro tempore; and

WHEREAS, the terms "mayor pro tempore" and "deputy mayor" are synonymous; and

WHEREAS, Escondido Municipal Code ("EMC") Chapter 2, Administration, Article 2, City Council, Section 2-24 provides procedures for the City Council to appoint a deputy mayor; and

WHEREAS, in 2013, the City Council established four city council districts; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to update the deputy mayor selection procedures to better ensure a fair and equitable rotation among councilmembers representing their respective districts.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED and the City Council of the City of Escondido DOES HEREBY ORDAIN as follows:

SECTION 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.

SECTION 2. That EMC, Chapter 2, Administration, Article 2, City Council, Section 2-24 is repealed and replaced as follows:

Sec. 2-24. Deputy Mayor Selection.

(a) The city council shall meet on the first Wednesday following certification of the results of the general municipal election and select a deputy mayor by appointment from among the councilmembers. If the deputy mayor

leaves elected office, the city council shall appoint a new deputy mayor at the next regular city council meeting.

- (b) The deputy mayor shall serve a one-year term.
- (c) The deputy mayor position shall rotate among councilmembers representing the four council districts.
 - (1) The city council shall appoint the deputy mayor based on seniority in current office. Each councilmember shall be appointed deputy mayor at least once during their four-year term in office.
 - (2) If multiple councilmembers have the same seniority at the time of appointment, the city council shall appoint the deputy mayor based on the highest votes received in the general election.
 - (3) If a councilmember fails or refuses to serve as deputy mayor, the councilmember shall not serve as deputy mayor until the other three councilmembers have another opportunity for appointment.
- (d) No city councilmember should be appointed deputy mayor during their first year in office.
- (e) The city council retains the right to appoint the deputy mayor by majority vote, notwithstanding subsection (b), whenever it deems necessary.

SECTION 3. SEPARABILITY. If any section, subsection sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is held invalid or unconstitutional for any reason by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions.

SECTION 4. That as of the effective date of this ordinance, all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. That the City Clerk is hereby directed to certify to the passage of this ordinance and to cause the same or a summary to be published one time within 15
