GRADING PERMIT:

The following items are required in order to obtain a Grading Permit:

GRADING PLAN:

All grading plans shall be prepared and signed by a Registered Civil Engineer when a grading permit is required by the Grading Ordinance.

GRADING BONDS:

A grading bond shall be posted for any project requiring a grading permit. The form of the bond shall be as follows:

- 1. Major and Minor Subdivisions
- a. *Surety Bond: Ninety (90) percent of approved engineer's estimate.
- b. **Cash Bond: Ten (10) percent of approved engineer's estimate (\$5,000 minimum, \$50,000 maximum).
- 2. Non-subdivision Project (i.e., single lots, commercial, etc.)

** Cash Bond: Ten (10) percent of engineer's estimate (\$5,000 minimum, \$50,000 maximum).

* Surety bonds may also be in the form of an instrument of credit or letter of credit.

** Cash bonds must be in a form immediately available to the City. Any cash bonds drawn on by the City shall be replaced by the developer prior to commencing work.

SOILS REPORTS:

A soils report shall be required in the following cases:

- 1. All grading in conjunction with a Major or Minor subdivision.
- 2. Any grading with extensive filling, generally with fills over 5 feet in depth (3 feet in "hillside grading areas").
- 3. Any site where over 1,000 C.Y. of earth is moved.
- 4. Whenever geological, groundwater, or other soil's factors need to be reviewed as determined by the City Engineer.
